











1. Brief Background on Who and Where the Poor Households Are




Figure 1 shows the magnitude of poor households within the twelve (12) municipalities of this province. Out of 41,107 households, 16,655 were identified as poor. ³ The municipality of Dinalupihan listed to have the highest number of poor households with 2,809 or 16.87%. It is followed by Hermosa with 1,707 or 10.25% and Mariveles with 1,678 or 10.08%.⁴



Figure 2 shows the income distribution of poor households within this province. All of the identified poor households within this province (16,655) were found to earn below the annual per capita poverty threshold of PHP 15,538 (the needed income for a family of six members to be out of poverty) ^{5.} This means that a poor household with six (6) members earns PHP42.6 per day. There were no poor household that were found to have an income which is above or equal to the average annual per capita income.

The poor households in Region III whose income are way below the thresholds can be correlated with the type of occupation they are engaged in and their highest level of education attained.

The table above shows the relationship between educational attainment and occupation. Majority of the members of the poor households who were not able to finish any level in elementary or high school education have no work (26,694) or land jobs in the agricultural community (7,465) or as labourers and unskilled workers (10,056).

2. Who and where the poor households are in terms of household composition?

The average household size among identified poor households is six (6) members. The total number of poor individuals within this province is 97,456. Of these, 46,870 are women whereas 50,586 are men. It can also be regarded that children comprises a large portion of the population of poor individuals with 53.98 % percentage share.

The combined sector of women and children constituted almost half of the individual population of the poor. The sector of the children constituted the largest part of the total number of poor individuals with 53.98% percentage share followed by the women sector which comprised the 48.09% of the total population of the poor individuals.⁷ The levels of different sectors are presented as follows:

A. Children's Sector



Figure 3 shows the number of children within this province whose ages were below 18 .The municipality of Dinalupihan, Hermosa and Mariveles were recorded to have the largest number of children in poor households. The percentage shares of poor children in these municipalities are 55.94%, 53.91% and 55.45% respectively.

Out of 27,803 children whose ages are within the interval 3 to 18 years, there were 8,772 or 31.55% who were not attending school. The municipality of Dinalupihan were recorded to have the largest number of poor children who were not attending school with 2,532 or 34.39%, followed by the municipality of Mariveles with 1,513 or 33.64% and Hermosa with 1,374 or 32.15%. In terms of educational attainment of poor children, 39.52% have reached elementary grade and only 14.39% were able to attain high school level.

b. Women Sector



One attribution to the data on occupation could be in educational attainment of women in poor households. About 20.97% of women in poor households were not able to finish or complete any grade level at all, and 14.29% are able to finish elementary grade as well as 16.18% were able to finish high school.

This shows that majority or 47.99% of the women in poor households were not able to complete either an elementary, high school or a college degree but was able to reach a certain level in either education level.

The sector of women constituted the 46,870 or 48.09 % of the total number of individuals within this province.

The women sector in the range 15 years old and above are mostly engaged as labourers and/or unskilled workers (12.55%) and service workers and shop and market sales workers (3.45%). Another data that is note worthy is the high magnitude of women in poor households declaring no occupation (79.85%).



c. Persons with Disability (PWD), Senior Citizens and Indigenous Peoples (IP) Group

There were 878 identified poor households with members who were found to have disability within this province. At an average, 125 households have a member who has any of the following disabilities e.g. hearing and visual impairment, speech defect, orthopaedic, multiple disabilities, mentally challenged and other disability.⁸

The individual senior citizens of the poor households comprised the 2,612 or 2.68% of the total number of individuals within this province. Mostly they are found within the municipality of Orani, Dinalupihan and Hermosa.





There are 287 poor households within this province who considered themselves as part of an indigenous people (IP) group. This constituted only a small part of the total poor households with only 5.14 % percentage share. They are mostly found within the municipality of Dinalupihan, Hermosa and Orion.

3. Who and where the poor households are in terms of educational attainment



Majority or 68.45% of poor individuals of ages 3-18 years old within this province were attending school, they were mostly found within the municipality of Dinalupihan, Mariveles and Hermosa. 9

The poor households put importance to education as evidenced by their attendance to school. Looking into age by level of schooling, 81.08% of the poor individuals whose ages were within the interval 6-11 years were attending elementary, 46.36% of the poor individuals whose ages were within the interval 12-15 years were attending high school, and 8.16% of the poor individuals whose ages were within the interval are 16-18 years were attending collegiate level. Notable is that 67.47% of the total poor households with school age children attends public school.

The highest educational attainment of poor individuals are significant in the levels of no grade completed (21.45 %) and high school (14.50 %). %. Majority of the poor households within this province had no grade completed. High concentration of these poor individuals can be found in the municipality of Dinalupihan, Mariveles and Hermosa..

4. Who and where the poor households are in terms of occupation?



The poor households source their income either as labourers to different menial jobs with 10,722 or 20.79%, through farming and fishing with 7,917 or 15.35% and service workers with 1,877 or 3.64%.

Quite notable is the number of members of the poor households declaring no occupation comprising to 56.08% (given that the age range for the table is 15 years old and above). 10

Majority of the members of poor households within this province who have declared no occupation were found within the municipality of Dinalupihan (55.87%), Hermosa (59.45%) and Limay (61.53%).



5. Household Features of Poor Households

Out of the 16,655 poor households within this province, 4,909 or 29.47% have roof that were made up of light materials (cogon, nipa or bamboo). Same is true for the outer walls, 5,940 or 54.80% of the poor households have walls which were made up of light materials. Based on these data, 4,121 or 24.74% of the poor households within this province were considered to be vulnerable to natural/man-made disasters as they used light construction materials on the roofs and outer walls of their housing units.¹¹






Figure 11 Figure 12



In terms of tenure status, out of the 16,655 poor households within this province, 6,197 or 57% have their *Own House but Rented Free Lot with Consent of the Owner*. These poor households can be mostly found in the municipality of Dinalupihan with 41.76%, Orion with 74.17% and Hermosa with 60.98%.¹²

Furthermore, this situation is aggravated as poor households' minimal access to basic service facilities is also high (see Table B)

For water and sanitary toilet facilities, it can be noted that the magnitude of poor households within this province with safe water source is relatively high at 78.3 % and that access to sanitary toilet is also fairly high with 46.3%. However, the number of poor households with no safe water source combined with unsanitary toilet practices¹⁵ is 2,116 or 12.7% of the total number of identified poor households.



Majority of the poor households within this province have access to electricity with 57% percentage share, whereas only 43% of the poor households have no access to electricity. The areas with still no access to electricity based on the number of poor households identified were found within the municipality of Dinalupihan (16.94%), Mariveles (13.39%) and Hermosa (10.69%).




The top three programs/services that the poor households within this province have received from different LGUs and NGOs were: Philhealth Cards with 19.09% percentage share, Day Care Service/ECCD with 12.06% and Subsidized Rice with 10.17%. However, it is quite alarming that majority of the identified poor households within this province do not received any programs or services from the government, LGUs and NGOs with 32.86% percentage share. ¹⁶

Certain conveniences are also part of the features of the poor households. Assets such as Television, VCD/DVD, and Furniture, Stereo/CD Player, and Telephone/Cell phone are but a few of the poor households owned assets.¹⁷



It is quite interesting that the priority of our poor households is entertainment (see Figure 15).

As presented in this paper, this poverty profile of the NHTS-PR identified poor households is based on existing NHTS-PR data as of July 2011. This poverty profile did not only focus the beam on the poor, it also attempted to emphasize the relevance and importance of identifying who and where the poor are and understanding their conditions and characteristics.
